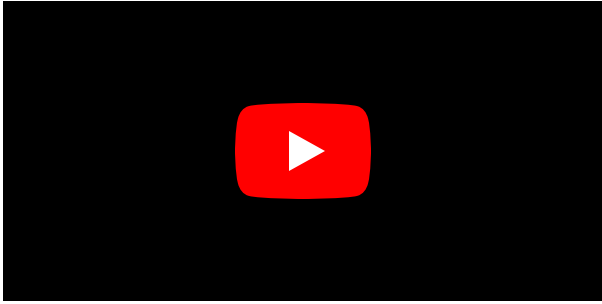

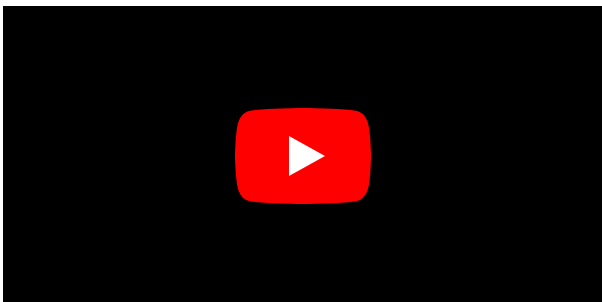


La Vie en Rose, played on the violin

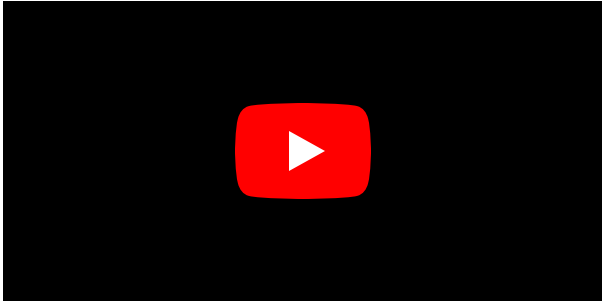

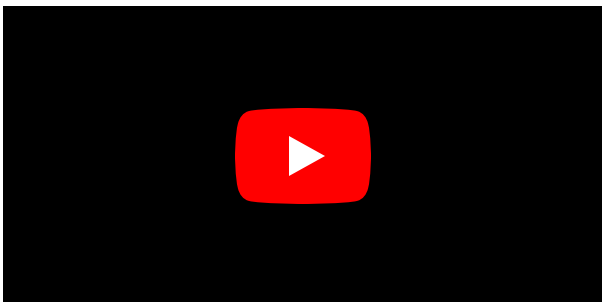


Canon in D, played on the violin

5. Greensleeves (Traditional English Melody)

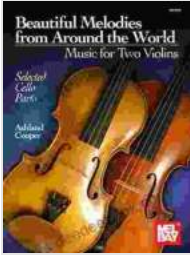
