Early Life and Career

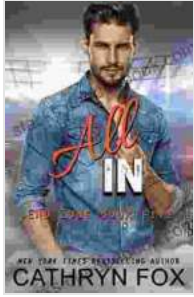

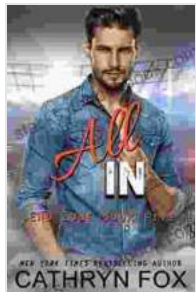
Personal Life and Legacy
