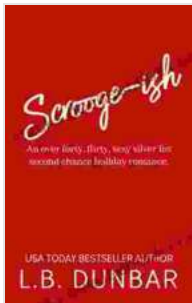


Scrooge's Second Chance: A Holiday Romance for the Ages

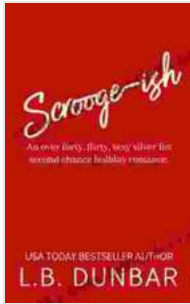
